CONDÉ COLLEGE THROUGH THE CENTURIES

Condé Vocational High School probably owes its name to Louis Prince de Condé, known as "The Great Condé", great captain of Louis XIV. The latter having claimed the region of Franche-Comté, when war broke out, Condé led the campaign.

On February 8, 1668, Besançon surrendered and Condé made his entrance, greeted by an artillery salute.

Three months later, the Treaty of Aix-La-Chapelle restored Besançon to the King of Spain and it would take the 2nd war in 1674 to settle the fate of the County which would become definitively French in 1678 by the Treaty of Nimègue.

The entrance to the school is located in Marulaz Square, which was first called Place Rondot Saint-Jacques, the name of the hospital that the canons of the Madeleine had built in the district in 1182 for pilgrims and travellers going to Compostela.

When this hospital was transferred to Chamars at the end of the 17th century and Besançon became the seat of an artillery school, the architect J. Querret du Bois built, in 1743, a barracks to house his troops. The barracks Royal-Artillery would be the first building of Condé College.

In 1947, the Montrapon Learning Center moved to Marulaz Square. The disciplines at that time were different from today's and responded to equally different economic needs.

- Household Discipline: The ancestors of today's bio-service discipline.
- Sewing Discipline: The students then found places as seamstresses, in department stores making alterations and in clothes workshops (Weil in Besançon).
- Cooking Disciplines: This discipline prepared the girls for a cooking vocational/professional qualification (CAP) to work in middle-class homes, in communities and sometimes in hotels. Others became cooking teachers, after a few years of experience.
- Horology/watchmaking Disciplines : At that time it was located in the Watchmaking school which today is the Lycée Jules Haag.

In the 50's, the students of Condé College learned trades which were traditionally feminine and required great meticulousness. They also had to learn to be "skilled housewives", it was the time of the housewife. In 2001, the school underwent a major restructuring of its buildings: creation of a wing dedicated to the catering and services sector (4 kitchens and 3 training restaurants), classrooms, girls' internship, gymnasium, kitchen and restaurant for half boarders and interns...

In 2012, the school obtained the label of "College of service and care and hospitality and catering" and training.

It brought together two training streams:

- The hotel and restaurant industry from CAP (vocational/professional qualification) to a "BAC Professionnel"
- Human services from CAP to a "BAC Professionnel"

In 2019, a new training course will be proposed within the College with the creation of "CAP Crémier-Fromager" (Vocational/Professional qualification for dairy products/cheese selling)







TRAINING OFFER AT CONDE VOCATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL

Condé vocational school is a professional school of about 490 students from the Doubs and nearby areas. Our training offer is presented in full detail on the school website

Well-known for its wide variety of educational courses, the school merges two kinds of sections, from NVQ to BTEC National: cooking and catering/Health care and services to the people.

Cooking and catering

At Condé Vocational school, students can prepare for the following diplomas:

NVQ (Vocational training) in cooking/Café hotel restaurant service/dairy products and cheese selling

BTEC National in Cooking/ marketing and catering services









Health and care to the people:

House helper NVQ (Diploma for technical assistant in home and communal environments) Childcare and homecare BTEC National/ Health and care to the people BTEC National

Since 2013, we also offer a special Caregiver training unit in apprenticeship (UFA). This Caregiver training depends on the local public College of Further Education (CFA), but all the teaching takes place at Condé High School in special adapted premises.











THE COMMITMENT OF COLLEGE STUDENTS: THE STUDENT COUNCIL (CONSEIL DE LA VIE LYCÉENNE) AND THE "MAISON DES LYCÉENS"

Student Council

Chaired by the school head, including a vice-president high school student, this council (CVL) brings together student and staff representatives who reflect together and make proposals on topics that affect everyday life. Thus, the commitment of high school students makes it possible to implement various initiatives.

The "Maison des Lycéens" (MDL)

This forum develops and supports sports, cultural, humanitarian and citizenship projects. The Student Council works with them to help them realize their projects and make them known.

To finance its projects, the forum has some funds (profits from drink distributors, contributions made at the beginning of year...). It also promotes the voice of college students: rights to have an association, a meeting, a publication, etc.

College commitment : a priority for Condé College

The Student Council is a body made up of 10 students elected from among all college students and adult volunteers.

This council is responsible for making proposals to improve the living conditions of students in college and promote their well-being.

The Student Council of Condé College is at the origin of several projects: organization of the interns party, choice of furniture for the college common room, commission menus for school meals.

All the students of Condé College are members of the "Maison des Lycéens" which allows the financing and animation of various projects, including those suggested by the Student Council. For example, it allowed the purchase of games and new furniture for the college student's room.

If you are dynamic, curious and you like building new projects, meeting new people and organizing events join the Student Council or the "Maison des Lycéens".








THE INTERNATIONAL OPENING AT CONDÉ COLLEGE

One of the objectives of our teams is to make every college student a citizen who has a global outlook on companies and the world. This is done by validating language skills and participating in European and international projects.

The college has a rich and fruitful partnership with foreign language structures and a long history of exchanges with the ESN (Erasmus Student Network) and the Centre of Applied Linguistics of Besançon. Among other things, there is the intervention of foreign students in the language courses in order to share their linguistic and cultural experiences.

Dozens of interventions in class allow our high school students to see the benefits of international mobility and to learn about the traditions, gastronomy, architecture of these foreign countries. In addition, these international students participate in our school's open house each year and are invited to attend oral presentations by our students.



This collaboration with the ESN and the CLA also results in the participation of our students and the staff of the school at many events: Forum on the theme of Mobility, Cultural Market, Gastronomic stories (confection of dishes + shows), the Merry month of Europe, Chinese New Year, Around the World in 80 dishes, Language café on worldwide countries traditions and workshops, events during Language Week ...

Condé College also gives ESN young people the opportunity to take part in immersion courses in the French education system. Thus, during each school year, one or more foreign students are accommodated in classes to follow different professional or general subjects.

Since the start of the 2017 school year, Condé high school has been part of the academic consortium "On the Move" which has made it possible to engage collectively in an Erasmus + approach. Thanks to European grants, funding makes it easier to set up mobility for students but also for staff members.

One of the objectives of the college in the field of modern languages has been to extend, from 2017/2018, international exchanges to the training in services and personal care (visits from health and social structures, exchanges with young people in similar training programmes). Thus, we have been able to develop a partnership with a reception center in Belgium that welcomes students from the ASSP sector.

The high school teams are committed to organizing and monitoring internships abroad while at the same time popularizing this system with families. Indeed, this information is disseminated to students, and future students of the college, during mini-courses and open days but also throughout the schooling. Thus, Condé college students have been able to carry out training period in Germany, England, Italy, Ireland and Belgium in recent years.

The teachers, who carry out the internship visits over 5 weeks in the final year, also take advantage of the stay abroad to contact companies and structures that could become future reception areas for our PFMP students.









Condé College has also hosted, under the program entitled "One year in France", a young Czech college student throughout the 2017/2018 school year. Assisted and supported by all the teams of the school, this student followed the same lessons as her classmates and brilliantly managed to obtain a CAP in catering services and DELF level B2.

It is within Condé College, open to Europe and the world, that various meetings and seminars were organized by the international cell of the Local Education Authority. Thus, the Franco-German seminar of the OFAJ took place in 2018 within the establishment where teachers from different regions of France and Germany were able to exchange and work together to set up many projects. In 2019, we also facilitated a Franco-German seminar organized by DAREIC to be held within the College.

The range of actions carried out, linguistically and internationally, by the staff of Condé College is testimony to its dynamism and desire to have a global outlook.

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AT CONDÉ COLLEGE

Condé College committed to a global sustainable development approach in the Autumn of 2017 and obtained, in May 2018, Level 2 certification. This academic recognition marks the commitment of the entire college's educational community to move towards more environmentally friendly practices.

Many actions have been put in place as part of this process:

- Installation of two teaching hives with honey menus made by two chefs' classes.
- Creation of a sustainable development room where all members of the educational community can deposit objects for recycling (pens, ink cartridges, batteries ...).
- Sensitization of all students with the collaboration of external participants at the start of the school year: recycling with "Sybert", energy saving with "EDF", methanization of food waste ...
- Installation, in every room of the establishment, of yellow bins for the recovery and recycling of paper and plastic.
- Distribution, in the self-service canteen, of individual breads made from flour from sustainable agriculture produced locally.
- Establishment of an internship programme for all staff to work on the issues of sustainable development and the fight against food waste.
- Implementation of educational projects including E3D with different classes.
- Awareness campaign with the realization of signage to encourage recycling.
- Establishment of an eco-class with students who will look after different projects on the theme of E3D.
- Eco-labelled cleaning products used in order to reduce their impact on health and the environment.
- Increased purchases of products from sustainable agriculture or organic products and products with short supply chains for the school canteen and also in the training kitchens.
- Implementation of many actions of the E3D approach at the social pillar level (example : collection of toys and clothes for people in precarious situations, partnership with a home for the elderly to establish links between generations).

A steering committee composed of about fifteen people (management, teachers...) meets about 2-3 times a year to monitor projects and plan future actions.

Glossary "E3D" - "Etablissement en Démarche de Développement Durable"

School or Establishment taking steps towards sustainable development: - when a school establishment commits to a global approach towards sustainable development - bringing concrete solutions to sustainable development objectives both in the school's way of operating (water, energy, rubbish etc..) and in its teaching.







THE COLLEGE ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

The Sports Association of Condé College is an association (as stipulated by law in 1901), which offers all students, whatever their level of sport, to play one or more sports activities (football, basketball, badminton, muscle building, handball ...) all year during the following slots:

- Monday from 5pm to 6pm (training and leisure)
- Tuesday from 5pm to 6pm (training and leisure)
- Wednesday afternoon (training from 1pm to 3pm and / or competitions from 1.30pm to 4.30pm)
- Thursday from 5pm to 6pm (training and leisure)





The objectives are as follows:

- Open up sports, artistic and community activities to a maximum number of students.
- Participate in championships organized by UNSS (at departmental, regional and national levels).
- Participate in leisure activities.
- Train students as Youth Officials (referees).

The Condé College Athletic Association also organizes occasional outdoor activity days throughout the year (ex: cross-country skiing in the Haut Doubs, downhill skiing in the Alps in Châtel, hiking, end-of-year outing ...).

One-third of Condé College students participate in the Sports Association's activities, supervised by Physical Education teachers.

Excellent results are obtained at the various championships:

- In 2018, high school students achieved podium positions, notably by winning the titles of departmental and academic champions in several disciplines such as badminton, the cross category "shared sport" or basketball. They were able to participate in the French championships in these different disciplines.
- In 2019, the women's badminton team finished in rank 11 in the French championships and one of the team member's even got national certification as a youth official.







THE CONDÉ COLLEGE INTERNSHIP









Condé College has a boarding school for girls and boys. The boys are accommodated in the boarding school located in building A while the girls' school is located in building H.

Both boarding schools benefit from an educational project to welcome students in the best possible conditions.

Our goal is to provide all intern students with a framework for living and working in a friendly way, thus ensuring the success of both.

Enrolment/Registration:

It is at the time of registration in June that the family makes the choice of the boarding school for the school year. Any change in regime is exceptional and must be justified by a "force majeure".

The framework:

Condé College can accommodate approximately 70 girls in rooms with 4 beds, some of which have 2 beds in the mezzanine. The boarding school can accommodate 30 boys who are also distributed in rooms of 4. Sanitary blocks with showers, washbasins and toilets are at disposal of the interns.

The schedules:

The interns are welcomed in the high school from Monday 7:30am to Friday morning.

Access to the rooms is possible from 5pm on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and 1pm on Wednesdays.

One hour of study is compulsory each evening in room or study.

Students must be present at the boarding school every day at 6:15pm. Students wake up at 06:40am and bedtime is at 10pm.

The coaching:

In each dormitory, an educational assistant responsible for coaching and student safety is there to listen to the young people. They are the mediator between the nurse and the Chief Education Advisor.

The Chief Education Advisor checks the absences every evening and ensures the organization and proper functioning of the boarding school. They are in charge of the contact with the families and the pedagogical teams to ensure individual follow-up of the pupils.

Activities:

A certain number of places to relax are available for interns (living room with TV, common room...). Activities and outings are offered during the year (sports activities at the gym, theatre or cinema, conferences, theatre forums ...).
